1. Meet the Candidates Evening

- The Ward Councillor candidates will have somewhat more time than the Local Board candidates. Housing, transport & rates will be the targeted topics.
- We will keep the focus on Meadowbank/St Johns/Kohi/Mission Bay.

- Volunteers are required for the evening to help with set up & pack down.

2. Pourewa Valley Clean Up

- Sunday 18th September at 1.30pm.
- Access is behind ASB Stadium next to Selwyn College.
- Bring gloves, spades & gumboots.

3. Auckland Transport

- Tim has followed up with AT. We have a new rep for the Orakei area, Felicity Merrington, who is arranging for someone from AT to come & talk to us. Transport is a hot topic & we would like to know what they are planning for the area.
- AT did promise to put in signs giving speed and/or slow down on Meadowbank Road but these have yet to appear. Kate has offered to follow up on this to find out where it is at.

- Bus Service Extension to Meadowbank train station – every other train station will have a bus service nearby except Meadowbank.
- A motion was passed to support the proposed pedestrian crossing near the intersection of Meadowbank Road & Mt Carmel Place.

- Tim will email AT about this and will also include the community constable for the area & Ken Baguley who holds the Transport Portfolio on the current Orakei Local Board.

4. Community Christmas Events

- Tim will contact St Chad's to see if they are planning to do anything this year.

Orakei Local Board Update (Kate Cooke)

- Grand Drive/Abbotts Way lights are up & running. Feedback given at the RA meeting:
 - Could do with better indication to let people know that the left hand lane heading east on Abbots Way is for left turn only;
 - People turning right out of Grand Drive are sometimes backed up when there is a bus stopped on Abbots Way.
- The generally feeling it was safer for all.
- Kate will ask our AT rep, Felicity, to contact Tim about the feedback now that the lights have gone in.
- Mary Fitzgerald from Fairfax noted that she ran a poll on Neighbourly about the lights. She gave the results of this to AT & they are aware of some of the issues & AT are also working on the phasing of the lights.
- Opening date of the Glen Innes to Tamaki Drive shared path – no opening date as of yet.
- There is a speed camera on Ngapipi Road (both directions).
- Unitary Plan – is open for appeal until the 16th September.

General Business: Men's Shed Auckland East (Terry Moore)

- There will be a meeting at the Orakei Community Centre on the 28th September. They are looking for an empty site & would like to partner with other community groups to build a dual purpose building. They are going to talk to Stonefields about working with them to build something. Meanwhile they are interested in doing community projects.
