HAVE YOUR SAY: St Johns Road – Pedestrian Refuge Island

Auckland Transport (AT) is seeking feedback on a proposal to install a pedestrian crossing facility and relocate an existing bus stop outside No. 181 on St Johns Road, St Johns.

We've included a consultation plan showing the proposed changes along with a freepost feedback form to be returned to us by **9 June 2016**.

What are the proposed changes?

- Introducing a pedestrian crossing facility outside No. 181 St Johns Road
- Relocating the existing bus stop from outside No. 183 St Johns Road to outside No. 177 St Johns Road
- Replacement of bus bay outside the college of St John the Evangelist on St Johns Road with a wider footpath
- Installing additional NSAAT restrictions to enable buses to access the bus stop without being blocked by other vehicles and to provide pedestrians and drivers with adequate inter-visibility when using the crossing facility

Why are the changes required?

A study has been undertaken to improve pedestrian crossing facilities along the length of St Johns Road. This section of the road has been identified as one of the locations where crossing improvements can be made. In an effort to improve safety, Auckland Transport is proposing to install new pedestrian refuge islands for improved visibility and to assist pedestrians crossing the road safely. The purpose of relocating the bus stop is to allow pedestrians to access the crossing point behind the bus and avoid crossing in front of the bus.

How do I provide feedback?

Please give us your feedback by going online to AT.govt.nz/trafficsafetyconsultations and completing the online survey. Alternatively, you can fill out the enclosed freepost feedback form and send it back.

We would like you to tell us:

- What aspects of the proposal do you like, and why?
- What aspects of the proposal would you change, and why?

We would also like to hear any other comments or concerns you have about the proposal.

What happens after the feedback period closes?

AT will consider all feedback received and make a decision on the final outcome. We will provide you with an update when this decision has been reached.
